What are natural disasters?

Forces of nature that cause destruction of life and property, they happen with little warning and occur all over the world. There are many types of natural disasters – earthquakes, landslides, tsunamis, floods, cyclones, blizzards, storm surges, heatwaves, volcanoes, wildfires and droughts.

What are floods?

Floods happen during heavy rains, when rivers overflow, when ocean waves come onshore, when snow melts too fast or when dams break. Flooding may be only a few inches of water or may cover a house to the rooftop. Floods that happen very quickly are called flash floods.

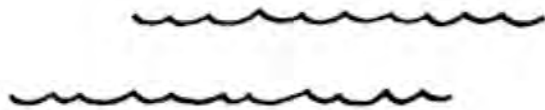

Who is Grand Mistress Fu?

A famous Chinese martial arts teacher and founder of the Mount Emei Wushu School. Grand Mistress Fu, also known as Shifu, is disciplined and tough yet has an enormous heart. She narrowly escaped death as her school collapsed during the Wenchuan Earthquake in May 2008 and has since dedicated her life to Disaster Risk Reduction.



What is The COPE Academy?

An international disaster hub, hidden in Sichuan Province, set up by Grand Mistress Fu. The COPE Squad – Candy, Ollie, Ping and Eddy are teenage orphans who were plucked out of their care homes to live at The COPE Academy and trained to be disaster risk reduction agents.

Winter had well and truly arrived in Mount Emei. Even in the December snow, Grand Mistress Fu still practiced her Tai Chi.





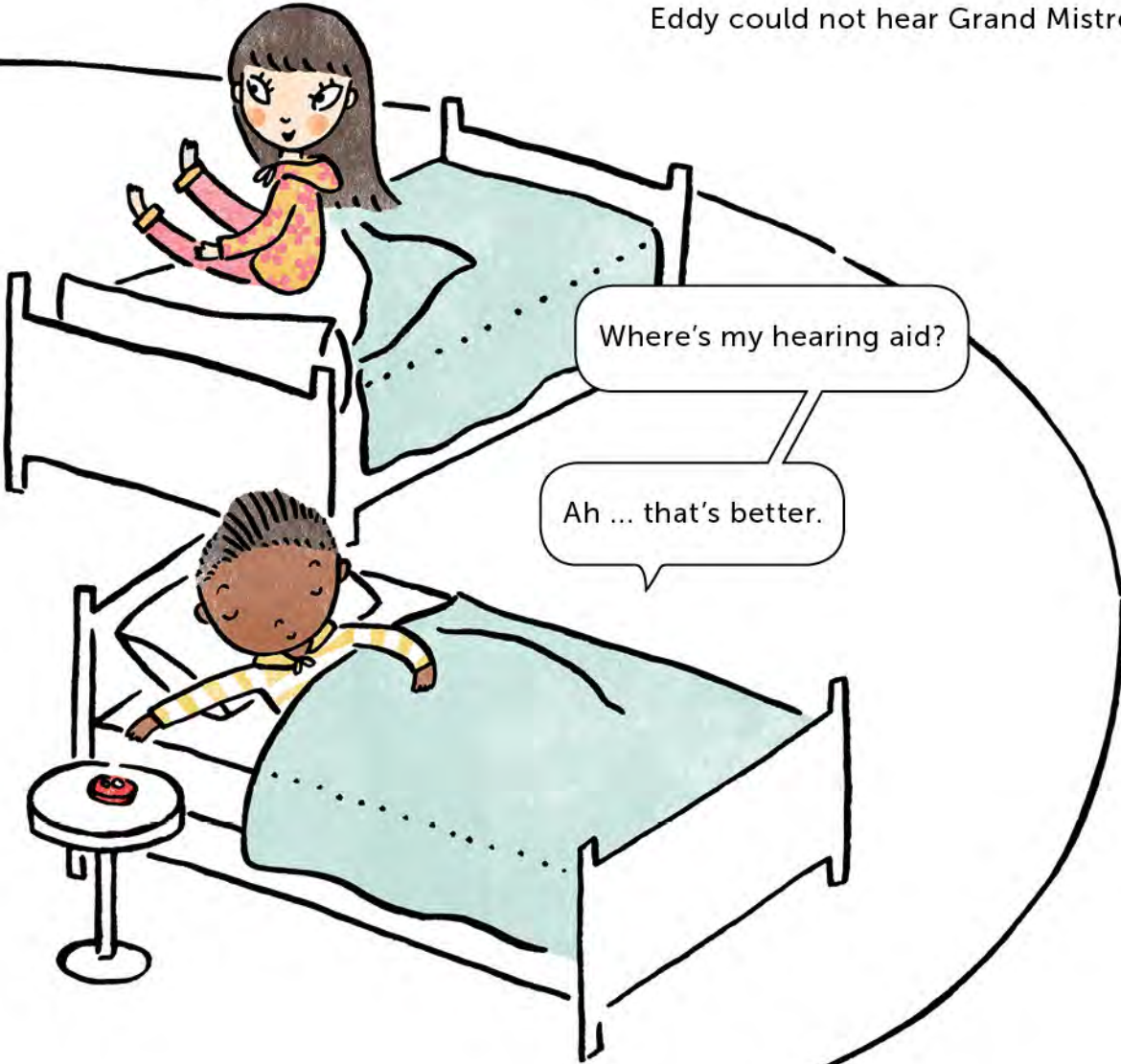
She gently picked up Sense and went

Meet me in the Zen Room for Yoga, 7am, sharp!



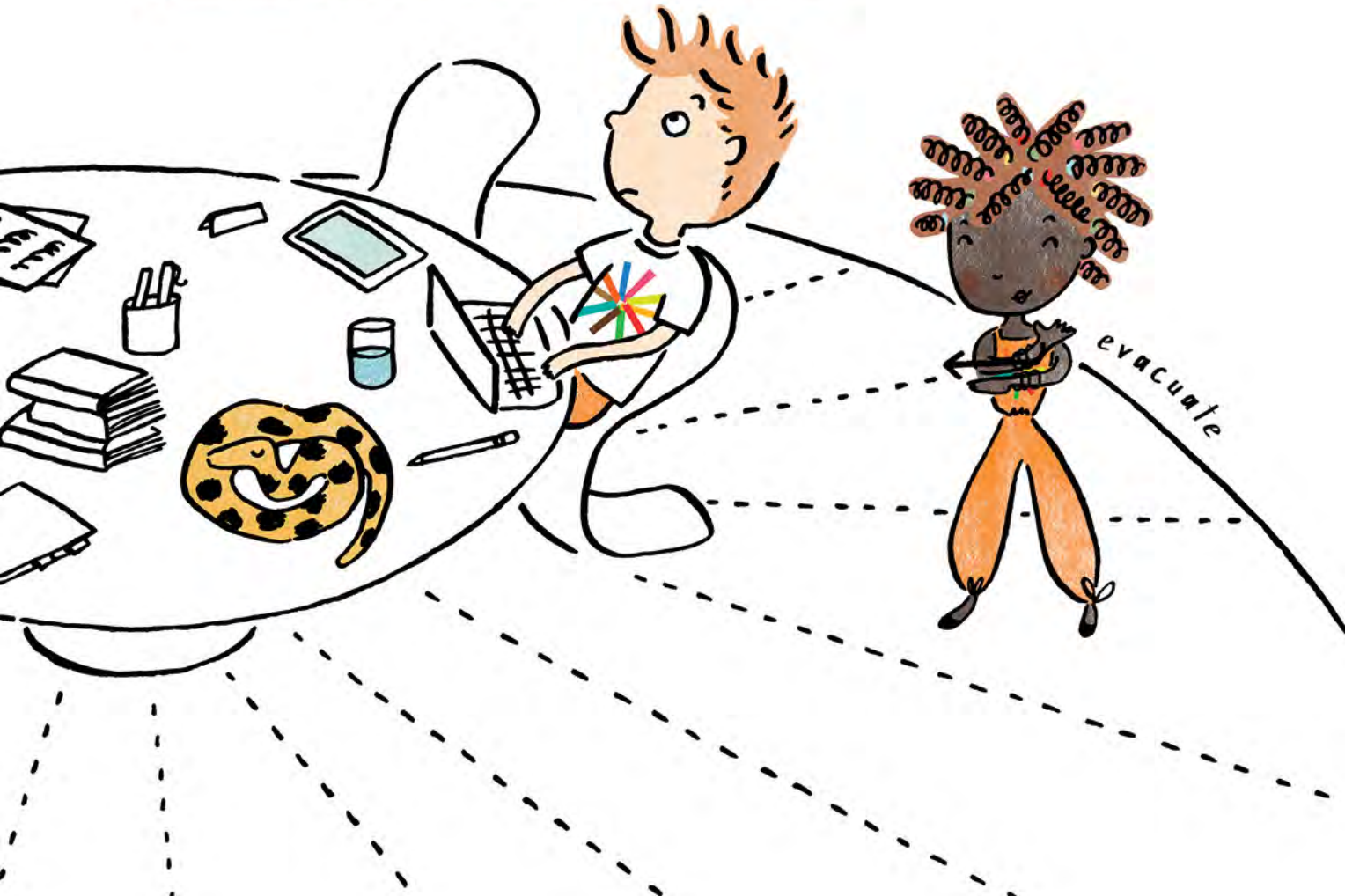
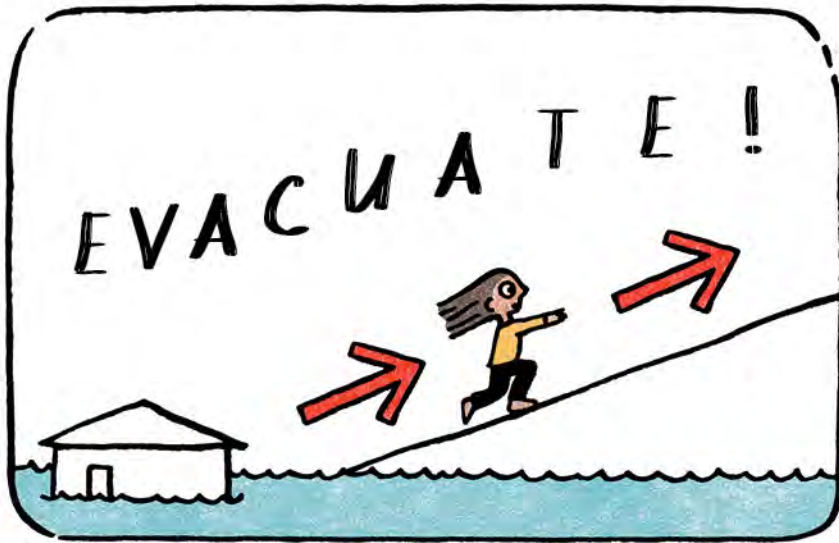


Close your eyes and take 3 deep breaths.

DURING A FLOOD?

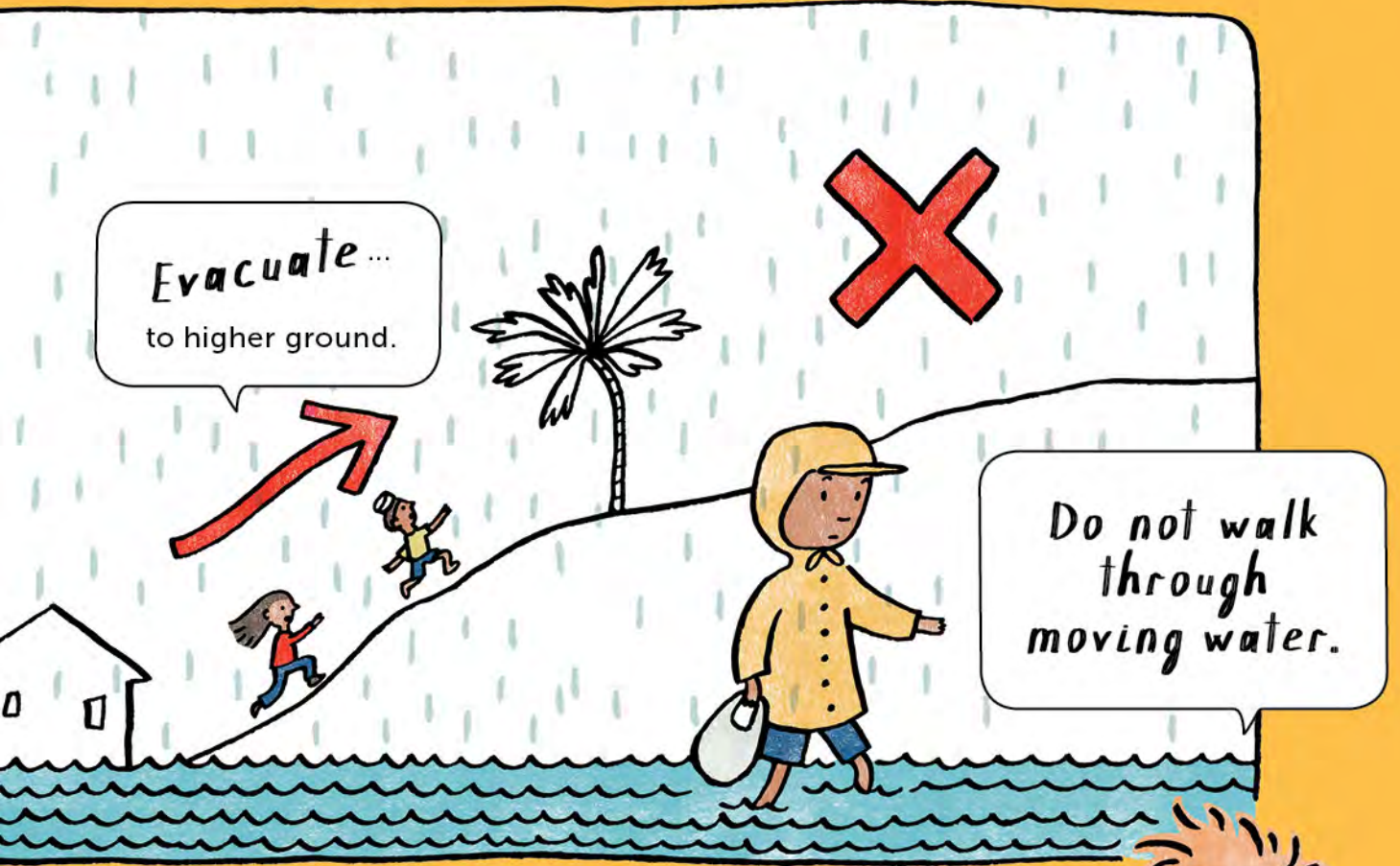


Listen

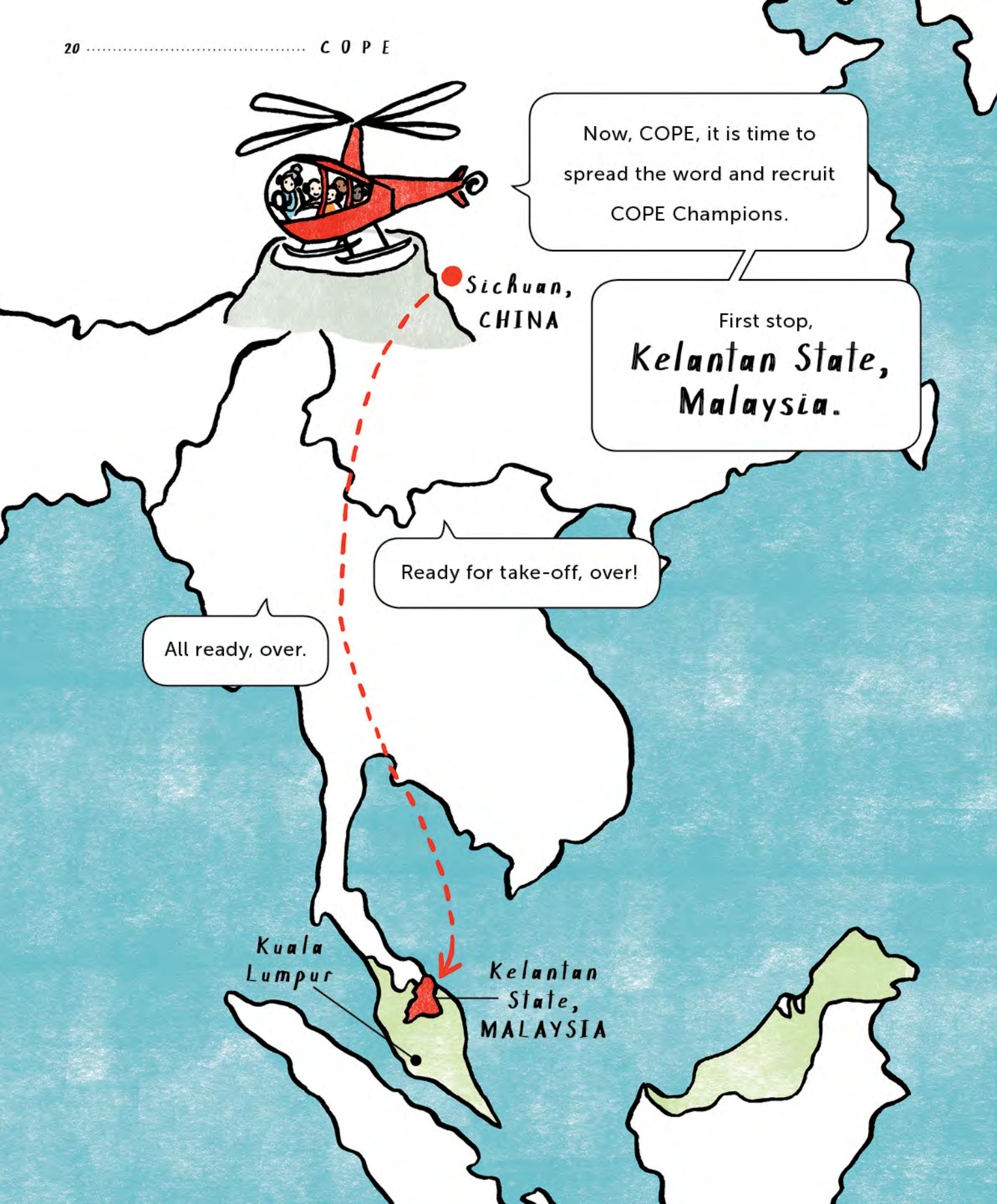

Oops, over!

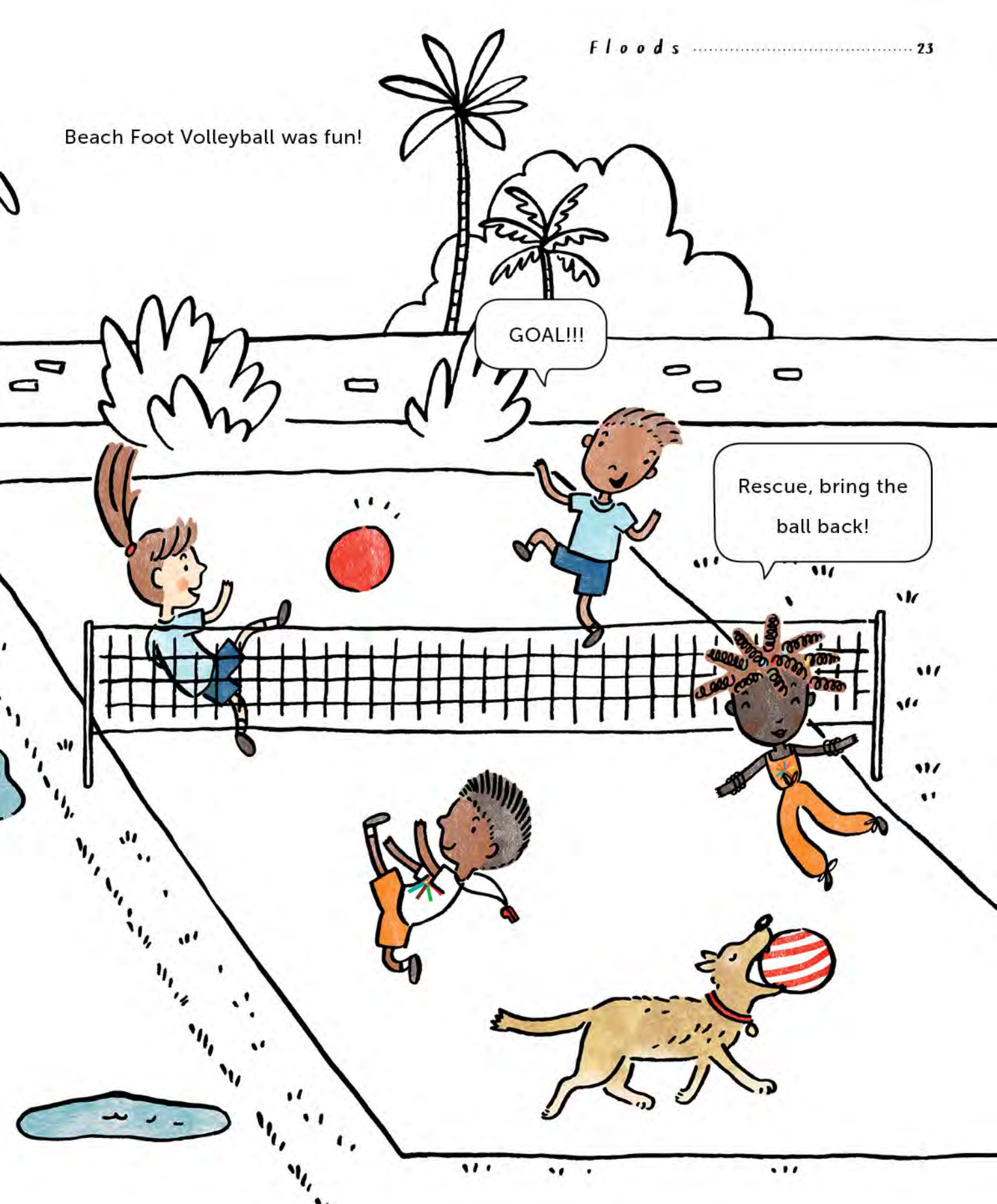
I have a spare one, over.

Beach Foot Volleyball was fun!



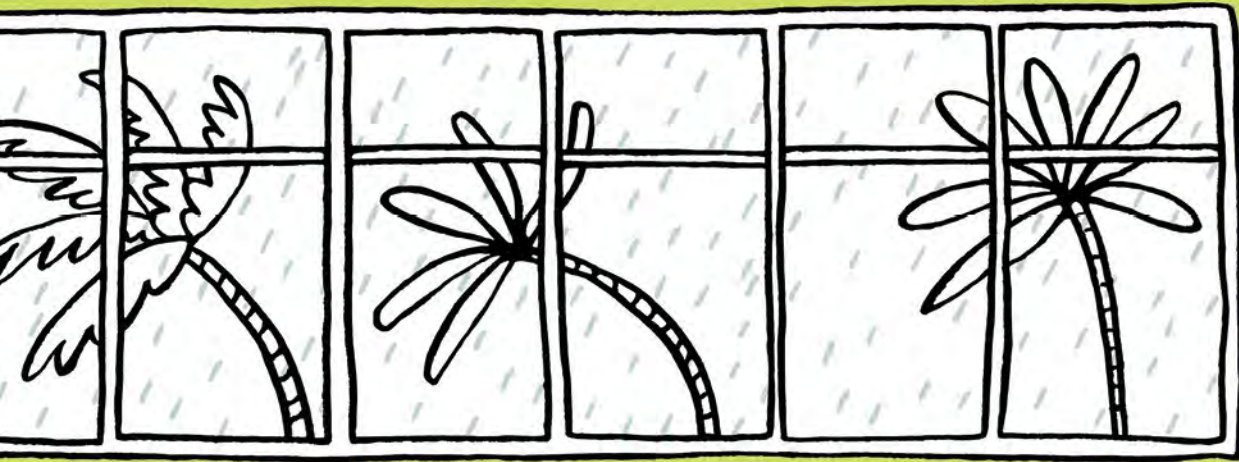
GOAL!!!

COPE went from village to village ... to shopping malls, markets and beaches.

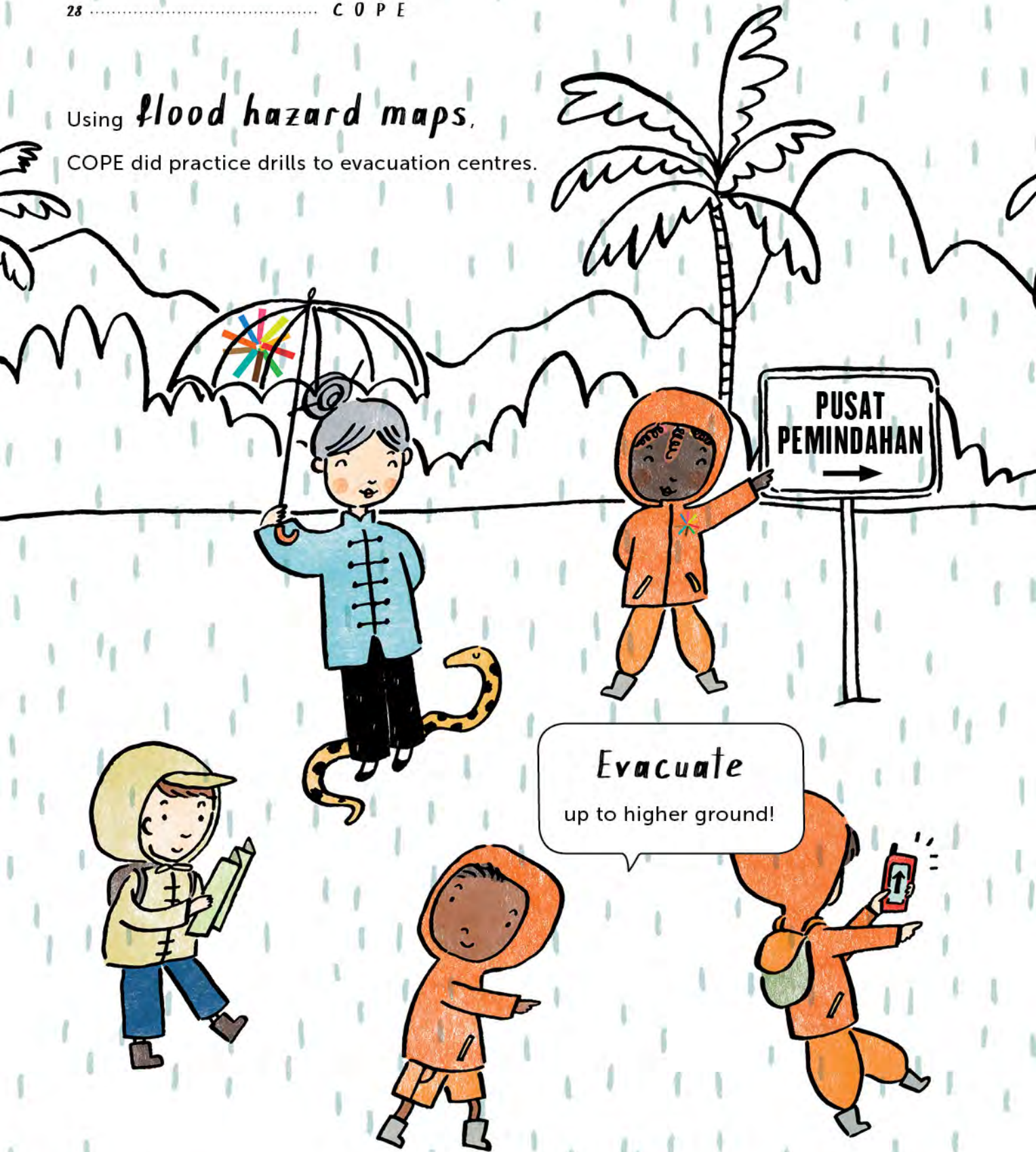


Selamat Petang! Hello!

Up there.

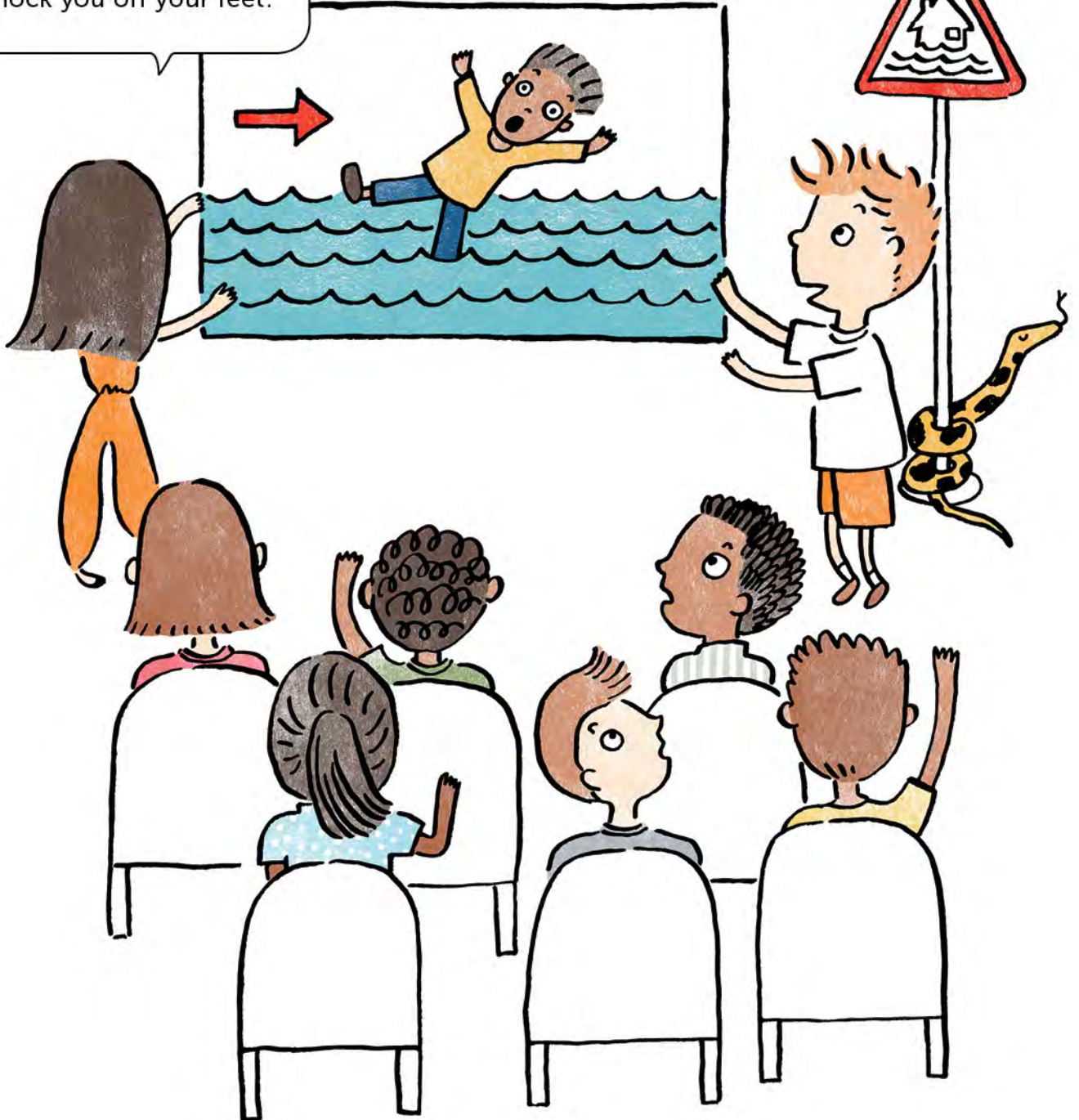
This way!

FLOOD!

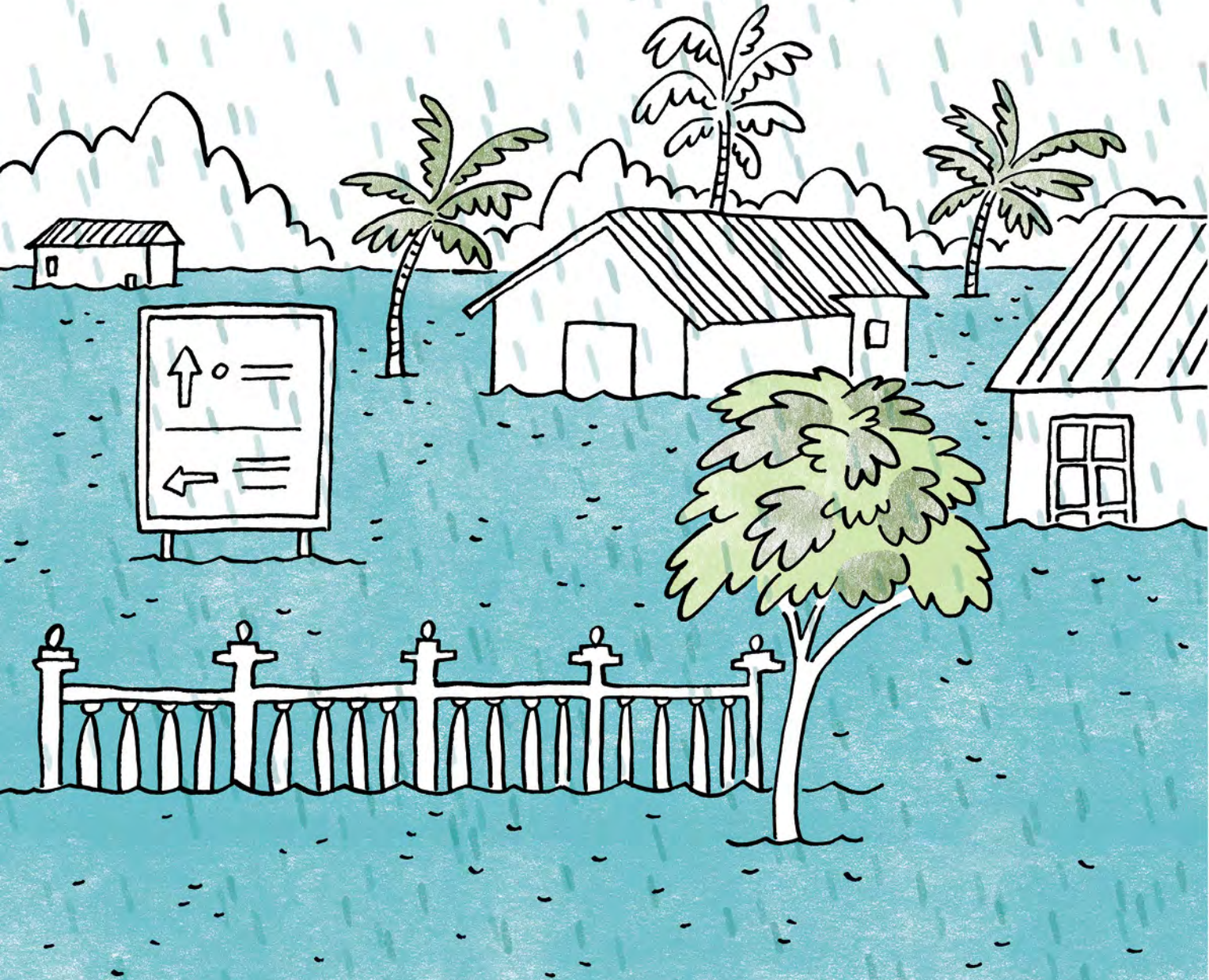


EVACUATE!

There he is!

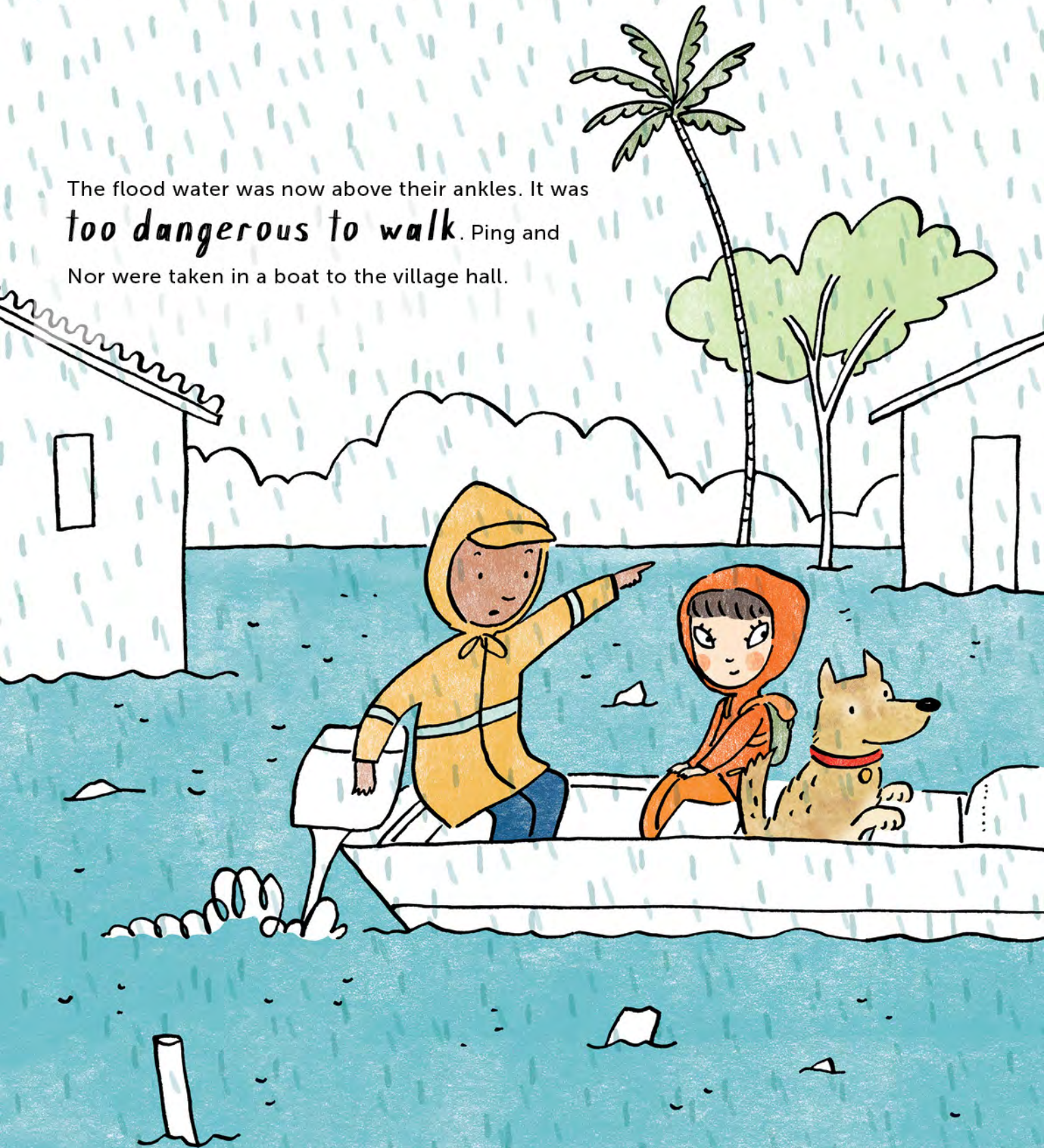
Hooray!

Families were given first aid, blankets, water and snacks. Some moved into tents until it was safe to go back home.





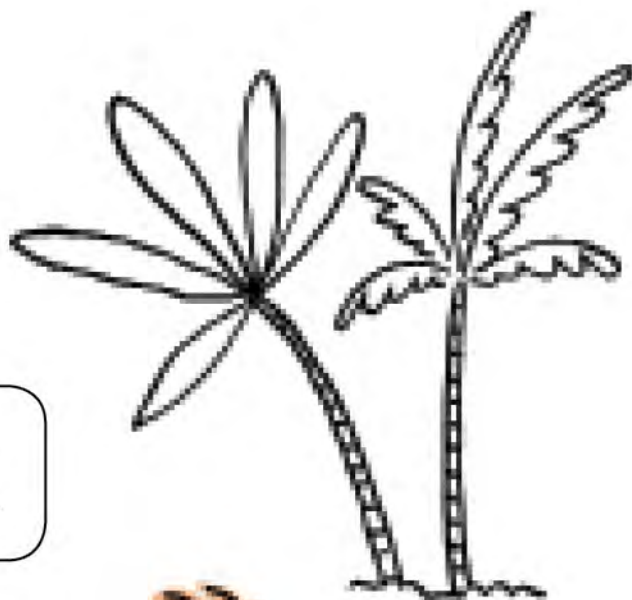
COPE helped with the post flood reconstruction.
